We are given a warning in the book of James 4:13-15,

The Covid-19 pandemic has created financial hardship for many residents in Windsor-Essex and the local food banks are stressed with their resource as well. Several Windsor-Essex county charity organizations put together a community wide event "June 27 Miracle" to collect non-perish food donations from the community. There are two ways to participate on this event. Simple put our non-perishable food donation at your front porch at 6/27, the event volunteer will

come to your door and pickup the donation. Or you can sign up for volunteers to help either driving around to pick up the donation or at the sorting center to help receiving the donations.

The Carmel and Jr.high fellowship was planning to attending the event but because the safety reason, the organizer only accepts volunteer registration by family.

Feed the hunger is one of the way to

demonstrate God's love. We strongly recommend our church member to step up to help out the community. You can simply participate in donating the food items.

Update from WCAC Epidemic Response Team

As you might read on the news, Ontario government announced Tuesday that starting from this Friday (6/12). 24 out of 34 regions of the province (Windsor is excluded) is moving into stage two of reopening. Along with province wide gathering under 10 people and place of worship is allowed to open and operated at 30% capacity. That means the church facility could be reopen as early as this weekend.

That is indeed good news and believe some of our members can't wait to come to church physically to worship our God and fellowship with each

other.

The Emergency Response Team start to plan the reopening plan 3 weeks ago when Ontario government announced entering into stage one reopening. Currently the ERT team has bi-weekly meeting and plan to finalize the reopening plan next week (6/19) and send for Elder Board approval by the end of the month. Meanwhile, the ERT team already starting to get the logistic of hygiene supplies and equipment ready for reopening.

Basically the member's safety is the highest priority of the reopening plan.

And we will open in stages as well. Starting from service team only live stream service to open other actives other than Sunday service. Please wait patiently for further communication.
