"Josiah....did what was right in the eyes of the Lord and followed the ways of his father David, not turning aside to the right or to the left."~2 Chronicles 34:1-2

The COVID Alert App is now available

You might have received a text message or email from your cell phone service provider that titled "The COVID Alert App is now available". This is not a spam text. This is for real.

Ontario is the first province where people can use COVID Alert to report a COVID-19 diagnosis.

Once you download the COVID Alert App. The app runs in the background and will not interrupt your activities.

Whenever you're near someone else with COVID Alert, both phones exchange random codes every 5 minutes.

The random codes change often and cannot be used to identify you.

If you test positive for COVID-19, your healthcare provider will give you a one-

time key. It tells COVID Alert that you can upload your random codes.

Every day, whenever it has an Internet connection, your phone will get a list of the random codes from people who reported a diagnosis.

If it finds codes that match, means you have been in contact with someone that is confirmed and put their confirm infection code into their app. the app notifies you that you've been exposed and explains what to do next.

The COVID Alert App does not require you put in your privy information like name, address and phone number. Therefore it is safe to use. How successful will it provide early warning of in contact with someone infected de-

pend on how many people download and use it. Then honestly report through the app to alert others. This is an effort from Government Canada to provide a tool for all Canadian to create a way to prevent the spreading of the virus. You can find the information in following website or search your phone's app store for "COVID Alert App" to download. Let help each other to fight the virous.

We are one step closer to reopening! Last weekend (8/1), a team of co-workers came to church and set up all the facility for reopening. Once we open, three congregations will have their own dedicated worship place. Each congregation will disinfect their facility after use and leave it for a week so the virus will not last on the surfaces for next service.

Now the arrangement is that

Mandarin will be in the Sanctuary, Cantonese in the Fellowship Hall and English in the Chapel.
