"Who touched me?" Jesus asked. When they all denied it, Peter said, "Master, the people are crowding and pressing against you." But Jesus said, "Someone touched me; I know that power had gone out from me." Then the woman, seeing that she could not go unnoticed, came trembling and fell at his feet. In the present of all people, she told why she had been instantly healed. Then he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has

healed you. Go in peace." Luke 8:43-48

Who are true Israelites? - Adam Yang

I will give them an undivided heart and put a new spirit in them; I will remove from them their heart of stone and give them a heart of flesh. Then they will follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws. They will be my people, and I will be their God. Ezekiel 11:19-20

- Canadian Pacific District (CPD)
- Western Canadian District (WCD)
- Midwest Canadian District (CMD)
- Central Canadian District (CCD)
- St. Lawrence District Quebec

• Eastern Canada District (ECD)



Each district office oversees the licensing, ordination, and supervision of the workers located in that geographic area. Each district has a District Superintendent and together with a team provide resources and guidance for local Alliance churches in areas of growth, leadership, Christian education, missions conferences, multicultural ministries, pastoral care, and church-planting.

Update from WCAC Epidemic Response Team

During the lock down time, there are plenty of bad news every day. One of the news reports that grabbed my attention reported that non-COVID 19 deaths also increased due to neglected/delayed medical care and fear of going to hospital according to US CDC. But there are encouraging news everyday. A group of teenagers started an online tutoring program to younger elementary aged children. One Detroit neighborhood had an assembly by staying on their own driveway and doing a square dance together.

How do we maintain a positive attitude to face the challenges caused by the pandemic situation? The answer is in the Bible.

Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction,

faithful in prayer. Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. Romans 12:12-15

- Prayer: Lift our worries into God's hands and pray for those who are suffering, pray for the government and church leaders to have wisdom to make right choice. And pray for the advance of God's kingdom.
- Instead of focusing on our own needs and worrying all the time, devote some time into charity. Think of others' needs and try to put into action to help.
- 3. Plan some small project to do either by yourself or with family. Plant a

small garden, learn to play guitar, organize an online reunion... All of these helps us to distract us from tapping into negative emotions.
