Ray and Trina Jones in Northumberland Ontario

There is no doubt that the current pandemic we are all faced with has created challenges for gathering. But, the pandemic is not the only challenge to opening up our lives and homes to others. We have discovered a common thread in our culture that can only be described as the "appearance barricade".

The appearance barricade prevents people from entering our sacred spaces (homes) because we feel that we need to have our homes all-together, looking great, with Martha Stewart level perfection. This prevents community and regular relational connection. This is why we are drawn to the crappy community dinner concept which essentially prioritizes people over place and treating people as family rather than guests.

Recently 5 families in our neighbourhood asked if we could begin having community (*crappy*) dinner on a weekly basis. When we had the first dinner, we thought that our neighbours might agree to a monthly dinner together so we were surprised when they requested a weekly practice - a welcome surprise for sure. And yes, we (like you) need to navigate the restrictions due to the pandemic, but when you have people motivated to build relationship and deepen friendship the creative juices start flowing and we are already thinking of some innovative ways for this to happen.

Learning to open up our lives and homes to others can be challenging because we all want to appear like we have it all together. We want to appear that things are always good and in order, rather than messy and at times just down right confusing, frustrating and chaotic. We believe that a life lived in Christ is characterized by learning to open up to new and endless possibilities embedded in relationships with others, as we focus on who we and others *really are*, not who we and others *appear to be*. Perhaps in a society that revolves around edited social media posts we are in desperate need of more crappy dinner connections.
