C&MA Pathways School of Ministry

Feel calling to serve God but not sure where to start? The C&MA Pathway program is a good starter for you.

Pathways School of Ministry is operated by the Central Canadian District of the Christian & Missionary Alliance and the course is held at Burlington Ontario.

Pathways offers both an undergraduate and a graduate program. The student will participate in seven academic courses and three field education courses. Academic courses are delivered utilizing a combination of intensive in-class time, online content delivery, and distance learning. Synchronous in-class sessions for the 2020-2021 year are being offered virtually using the Zoom platform. The field education courses require students to be actively involved in a church or parachurch ministry, where student will receive hands-on opportunities for



development and mentorship from experienced ministry leaders.

Pathways partner with McMatser Divinity College and Emmanuel Bible College to deliver a certificated program for the Christian who interested in devoting to serve especially in C&MA member churches. The certificate also is credited toward seminary degree if participant decides to get their degree at the affiliated seminary schools.
